While sometimes not given its due in Traditional East Asian Medicine (TEAM), palpation is particularly suited to help those of us practicing it now. It enables us to get quick feedback on our treatments and to engage the medicine in an immediate and fresh way, while allowing us to more effectively learn from and treat our patients. In this session we will discuss some ways in which palpation can be integrated into anyone's practice and touch on a synthesis of osteopathic palpation and TEAM that the presenter has been helping develop for 30 years.
